## Grammar Carlton Premiers win Alan McEvoy Memorial Shield!!

Ponsonby's six year strangle hold on the Alan McEvoy Memorial Shield came to an end on Saturday as an Ash Moeke drop goal five minutes from fulltime clinched a thrilling 20-19 victory for Grammar-Carlton at Cornwall Park.

Trailing by 19-17 in the dying minutes of the game, Ash Moeke held his composure after missing an earlier attempted drop goal to strike the ball superbly from 40 metres out and give Grammar-Carlton the Alan McEvoy Memorial Shield for the first time in nine years.

While it has been their incredible try scoring feats which have entertained the parochial Grammar Carlton crowd over the past few weeks, it was their defence today which won them the game as Ponsonby were unable to find any way through their watertight and well organised defensive line.

Two penalty goals to impressive young first five-eighths Gareth Anscombe gave Ponsonby an early 6-0 lead before Moeke narrowed the deficit with a penalty of his own.

The decisive blow for Grammar-Carlton came 20 minutes in as Bryce Heem made a lovely break on the blindside to put winger Thomas Timani over in the corner as the home side took the lead and an 8-6 advantage into the sheds at halftime.

Ponsonby started the better of the two teams in the second half, with Anscombe landing another penalty and halfback Kane Hancy almost scoring an intercept try as he scooted down the touchline, but a disappointing chip kick gave the ball back to the opposition.

In the battle of the two best sharpshooters in the competition, Moeke landed two further penalties to push the score out to 14-9 before Anscombe responded with another well executed strike.

But as Ponsonby have done so many times before, they looked to have clinched the match winning try eight minutes from full time as their forwards produced a brilliant rolling maul before Willie Uili picked and went from the back to barge over the line.

Anscombe landed the conversion in a flawless day with the boot to extend the lead to 19-17, but it was Moeke who would have the final say, his forwards doing a brilliant job of getting him into a prime position from where he was able to kick the ball between the posts as the crowd broke into rapturous applause.

Grammar Carlton head coach Craig Hall was understandably ecstatic with the result.

"Every time there's a trophy on the line we want to go out and win it and that's what we're in the business of doing. It means everything to the club to get the trophy but number one position on the table is great as well," Hall said.

"I thought it was really gutsy, it was always going to be a slog and at halftime we talked about penalties. Anscombe was kicking them from everywhere and I think it was well into the 15th minute plus that we gave away a penalty in the second half and I just knew that if they couldn't keep turning us around and getting those penalties that we would hang in there."

But while he was thrilled to add the Alan McEvoy Memorial Shield to the trophy cabinet alongside the Waka Nathan Challenge Cup, Hall said his side was utterly committed to going one better and claiming the illusive Gallaher Shield this year.

"That's the ultimate prize and when people look back on the records of 2010, they're probably not going to remember who won the Waka Nathan or Alan McEvoy, they'll want to know who won the Gallaher Shield so that's the next one in line for us."
